Celebrate Lakes Appreciation Month in Colorado

22nd Annual Great North American Secchi Dip-In (July 1 -31)

July is Lakes Appreciation Month – It's here! LAM is celebrated across the United States and here in Colorado. Millions of people across the country visit a lake, pond, or reservoir during the month of July. Fourth of July fireworks are often displayed over water. All of these summer-time lake activities need to be appreciated. Here is a short list of LAM events across Colorado. Do your part and go to one to celebrate our lakes and reservoirs.

Barr Lake (July 11th) – shoreline cleanup, tree planting, weed removal, and maintenance in the morning, free lunch at noon, and then fun waterside activities in the afternoon. RSVP, they are expecting over 200 volunteers.

Cherry Creek Reservoir (July 18th) – 8am volunteers will help with projects around the reservoir followed with a shrimp fry lunch. Fun activities and boat rides will be in the afternoon. Please register to get your goody bag.

Boyd Lake (July 18th) – 8am to noon for shoreline clean up, then an afternoon of fun opportunities like boat demos, archery and fishing clinics, boat safety tips, and search and rescue demos. The press release has contact info for more details.

Fireworks over the water – Grand Lake, Ridgeway Reservoir, Lake Estes, Sheldon Lake (Ft. Collins), Dillon Reservoir, Georgetown Lake, Granby Reservoir, Keystone Lake (Keystone), Lake Loveland (Loveland), Baker Reservoir, Webster Lake (Northglenn), Lake DeWeese (Westcliffe), Windsor Lake (Windsor), and many other city fireworks that are shooting off over local parks that have ponds on them.
