**Lake Word of the Month** – Seiche [seysh] - an occasional and sudden oscillation of the water of a lake producing fluctuations in the water level caused by wind typically. This happens in larger bodies of water. For example, Lake Erie can have a 10 foot difference in water level between Toledo and Buffalo. And used in a sentence to sound smart, “Wow, did you see that seiche when your brother jumped into the lake?”

**Website of the Month** – [www.colorado.gov/pacific/cdphe/WQ-10-Year-Roadmap](http://www.colorado.gov/pacific/cdphe/WQ-10-Year-Roadmap) - The Water Quality Control Commission has a plan to adopt water quality goals for nutrients (nitrogen, phosphorus, and chlorophyll-a), cadmium, temperature, arsenic, ammonia, and selenium through 2027. They have developed a 10-year road map to have all these water quality goals adopted. In 2021, they will release the drafts for nitrogen and phosphorus criteria for lakes. Then the state will adopt the chlorophyll-a criteria statewide in 2022. These two mile markers are just around the corner for this 10-year road. This website is a good link to have that gets you to workgroup meeting updates, the actual road map, and other documents.
