



Milton Reservoir Water Quality Report



May 10, 2016

Water Summary

Milton Reservoir (aka Pelican Lake) is sampled twice a month between March and October and monthly between November and February. The Barr Lake and Milton Reservoir Watershed Association coordinates all of the efforts to monitor, test, and improve the water quality in Milton. Regular lake sampling started in 2002 and will continue into the future. It is important to closely monitor water quality to observe any major changes that would impact wildlife, park users, or downstream water users.


May – Milton’s water clarity has been up and down this spring. Clarity increased again for May 10th and was over 4 meters deep. Inflows and nutrients have not changed much this spring. Spring time storms could impact algal growth and water clarity. Cloud cover blocking the sun can slow down primary productivity as well as provide cooler air temperatures. Fast moving storms over Milton can also generate strong wave action that fully mixes the water column and suspends sediments in shallow areas. Whatever causes the changes, it is interesting to see how a reservoir’s water quality can change quickly from week to week.

Water Quality Stats (as of 05-10-16)

Maximum Depth: 26.2 feet (dam outlet) Water Temperature: 56.9^o F (taken 3 feet below surface)

Water Clarity: 14.3 feet (≥ 3 feet is good) Dissolved Oxygen: 122% (>80% is good)

pH: 8.41 (between 6 and 9 is good) Chlorophyll-a: <2 ppb (How green, ≤ 25 is good)



Spring has sprung. Do your best to keep fertilizers off of the sidewalk, roads, and driveways. You want your lawn green, not the lake.



Buy phosphorus-free fertilizer and keep our water clean.

Rainwater can quickly wash phosphorus from fertilizer into our water system. Phosphorus is the junk food for algae, causing it to grow out of control, turning our waters green, lowering water quality and even killing fish. Use phosphorus free lawn fertilizers to keep it clean.
