

Milton Reservoir Water Quality Report



June 28, 2017

Water Summary

Milton Reservoir (aka Pelican Lake) is sampled twice a month between March and October and monthly between November and February. The Barr Lake and Milton Reservoir Watershed Association coordinates all of the efforts to monitor, test, and improve the water quality in Milton. Regular lake sampling started in 2002 and will continue into the future. It is important to closely monitor water quality to observe any major changes that would impact wildlife, park users, or downstream water users.

June – Milton Reservoir is experiencing a blue-green algae bloom (aphanizomenon). Water is still fairly clear with large clumps of algae floating. There was no surface scum on the water except at the west boat ramp. Other plants are also growing, duckweed, filamentous green algae, and pondweed near the shoreline. This is definitely the growing season for Milton. The water level was slightly down compared to June 13th. The lake is thermally stratified slightly – top water down to about 5 meters is warmer/lighter than the cooler/heavier water between 5 meters and 8 meters. No blue-green algae were growing below 5 meters.


Maximum Depth: 25.3 feet Water Temperature: 74.4° F (dam outlet) (taken 3 feet below surface)

Water Clarity: 3.8 feet (≥ 3 feet is good)

Dissolved Oxygen: 213% (>80% is good)

pH: 9.04 (between 6 and 9 is good)

Chlorophyll-a: <50 ppb (How green, ≤ 25 is good)
