



Barr Lake Water Quality Report



September 23, 2020

Water Summary

Barr Lake is sampled twice a month between March and October and monthly between November and February. The Barr Lake and Milton Reservoir Watershed Association coordinates all of the efforts to monitor, test, and improve the water quality in Barr Lake. Regular lake sampling started in 2002 and will continue into the future. It is important to closely monitor water quality to observe any major changes that would impact wildlife, park users, or downstream water users.

September – Barr Lake seems to be as low as it will go with only evaporation and groundwater seepage that might make it drop slightly. This is a clear visual example on the differences between natural lakes and human-made reservoirs. Natural lakes fluctuate by inches while reservoirs like Barr Lake change by tens of feet. Algae are growing again helping with the dissolved oxygen levels. Water temperatures are slightly higher than in early September. Close to 450 carp were removed last week using the box net. This ends the official growing season for lakes and reservoirs. Next, is the fall season and the beginning of refilling Barr Lake.

Do your part. Keep trash out of Barr Lake. Tires, mattresses, oil cans, Styrofoam, and just about anything else ends up at Barr Lake. Keep trash out of the storm drains by picking up trash you see.

Maximum Depth: 6.6 feet (between dam outlets) Water Temperature: 65.9^o F (taken 3 feet below surface)

Water Clarity: 0.7 feet (≥ 3 feet is good) Dissolved Oxygen: 102.7% (>80% is good)

pH: 8.21 (between 6 and 9 is good) Chlorophyll-a: <20 ppb (How green, ≤ 25 is good)
